1) Deprivation Rank	The rank for deprivation for the Amesbury Five Wishes children's centre is 19 out of the 30 children's centres (1 being the least deprived, 30 being the most deprived).
2) Population (All)*	The total population covered by the Amesbury Five Wishes children's centre is 18583. The average population covered by children's centres in Wiltshire is 15699.
3) Population (0-5 years)*	The number of children aged 0-5 in the Amesbury Five Wishes children's centre locality is 1326. On average a children centre in Wiltshire has 3032 children aged 0-5 in it's area. The percentage of the population aged between 0 and 5 years in the Amesbury Five Wishes children's centre locality is 7.1%. This is similar to the Wiltshire value of 7.2%.
4) Population (0-15 years)*	The population of 0-15 year olds covered by the Amesbury Five Wishes children's centre is 3602. The percentage of the population aged between 0 and 15 years in the Amesbury Five Wishes children's centre locality is 19.4%. This is similar to the Wiltshire value of 19.3%.
5) Children in poverty (0-19 years)	The percentage of children defined as living in poverty within the catchment of the Amesbury Five Wishes children's centre is 10.8%. This is similar to the Wiltshire value of 11.6%.
6) Vulnerable Families (with children 0-4 years)	The percentage of families classed as vulnerable in the area covered by this children's centre is 8.5%. This is significantly lower than the Wiltshire value of 11.7%. The rank for percentage of vulnerable families for the Amesbury Five Wishes children's centre is 7 out of the 30 children's centres.
7) Special education needs	There are 230 per 1000 children aged 2 to 10 who are registered with special educational needs in the Amesbury Five Wishes children's centre area. This is significantly higher than the Wiltshire value of 190 per 1000.
8) Teenage Conception Rate	Health and Wellbeing The teenage conception rate in Amesbury Five Wishes children's centre locality is 35 per 1,000 females aged 15-17. This is not significantly different to the Wiltshire rate of 27 per 1,000.
9) Breastfeeding 6-8 wks	The percentage of mothers breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks is 44.3%. This is not significantly different to the Wiltshire value of 49.7%.
10) DIPH Immunisations*	The percentage of children in Amesbury Five Wishes who received all three primary doses of DTP/IPV/Hib8 vaccine in the first year of life is 100%. This is higher than the Wiltshire value of 98.9%.
11) MMR Immunisations*	The percentage of children in Amesbury Five Wishes who received a primary dose of MMR vaccine before their 2nd birthday is 98.1%. This is higher than the Wiltshire value of 96.3%.
12) Accidents (0-4 years)	There are approximately 47 admissions per year due to accidents in the 0-4 age group in Amesbury Five Wishes. This is equivalent to approximately 1584 per 100,000 in 0-4 year olds in Amesbury Five Wishes. This is not statistically different from the Wiltshire value of 1230 per 100,000 per year.

13) Obesity in Reception	The percentage of obese children in Reception year is 7.4% This is not significantly different to the Wiltshire value of 8.1%.
14) Overweight and Obese in Reception	The percentage of overweight and obese children in Reception year is 18.7% This is not significantly different to the Wiltshire value of 21.4%.
15) Obesity in Year 6	The percentage of obese children in Year 6 is 18.2% This is not significantly different to the Wiltshire value of 16%.
16) Overweight and Obese in Year 6	The percentage of overweight and obese children in Year 6 is 32.4% This is not significantly different to the Wiltshire value of 30%. Notes and Metadata
