

**Population and Inequality**

<b>1) Deprivation Rank</b>	The rank for deprivation for the Downton Clearbury children's centre is 10 out of the 30 children's centres (1 being the least deprived, 30 being the most deprived).
<b>2) Population (All)*</b>	The total population covered by the Downton Clearbury children's centre is 22353. The average population covered by children's centres in Wiltshire is 15699.
<b>3) Population (0-5 years)*</b>	The number of children aged 0-5 in the Downton Clearbury children's centre locality is 1419. On average a children centre in Wiltshire has 3032 children aged 0-5 in it's area. The percentage of the population aged between 0 and 5 years in the Downton Clearbury children's centre locality is 6.3%. This is lower than the Wiltshire value of 7.2%.
<b>4) Population (0-15 years)*</b>	The population of 0-15 year olds covered by the Downton Clearbury children's centre is 4108. The percentage of the population aged between 0 and 15 years in the Downton Clearbury children's centre locality is 18.4%. This is lower than the Wiltshire value of 19.3%.
<b>5) Children in poverty (0-19 years)</b>	The percentage of children defined as living in poverty within the catchment of the Downton Clearbury children's centre is 8%. This is lower than the Wiltshire value of 11.6%.
<b>6) Vulnerable Families (with children 0-4 years)</b>	The percentage of families classed as vulnerable in the area covered by this children's centre is 17.2%. This is significantly higher than the Wiltshire value of 11.7%. The rank for percentage of vulnerable families for the Downton Clearbury children's centre is 27 out of the 30 children's centres.
<b>7) Special education needs</b>	There are 142 per 1000 children aged 2 to 10 who are registered with special educational needs in the Downton Clearbury children's centre area. This is significantly lower than the Wiltshire value of 190 per 1000.

**Health and Wellbeing**

<b>8) Teenage Conception Rate</b>	The teenage conception rate in Downton Clearbury children's centre locality is 15 per 1,000 females aged 15-17. This is significantly lower than the Wiltshire rate of 27 per 1,000.
<b>9) Breastfeeding 6-8 wks</b>	The percentage of mothers breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks is 57.4%. This is not significantly different to the Wiltshire value of 49.7%.
<b>10) DIPH Immunisations*</b>	The percentage of children in Downton Clearbury who received all three primary doses of DTP/IPV/Hib8 vaccine in the first year of life is 99.4%. This is higher than the Wiltshire value of 98.9%.
<b>11) MMR Immunisations*</b>	The percentage of children in Downton Clearbury who received a primary dose of MMR vaccine before their 2nd birthday is 96.2%. This is higher than the Wiltshire value of 96.3%.
<b>12) Accidents (0-4 years)</b>	There are approximately 50 admissions per year due to accidents in the 0-4 age group in Downton Clearbury. This is equivalent to approximately 1537 per 100,000 in 0-4 year olds in Downton Clearbury. This is not statistically different from the Wiltshire value of 1230 per 100,000 per year.

**Childhood Obesity**

<b>13) Obesity in Reception</b>	The percentage of obese children in Reception year is 8.7% This is not significantly different to the Wiltshire value of 8.1%.
<b>14) Overweight and Obese in Reception</b>	The percentage of overweight and obese children in Reception year is 20.8% This is not significantly different to the Wiltshire value of 21.4%.
<b>15) Obesity in Year 6</b>	The percentage of obese children in Year 6 is 11.7% This is significantly lower than the Wiltshire value of 16%.
<b>16) Overweight and Obese in Year 6</b>	The percentage of overweight and obese children in Year 6 is 23.9% This is significantly lower than the Wiltshire value of 30%.
